

In her serial photographs, **Inge Dick** (b. 1943, Vienna, Austria) explores the time- and light-based medium of photography in an extremely “essential” manner. The artist lets time work for her, so to speak. She photographs how the light changes over the course of a day, a month or year. She uses the “instant photo” technique to create large-format Polaroids with extraordinary presence. Inge Dick’s innovative work enjoys an outstanding position, which was proven not least by her participation in the exhibition “Shape of Light” (2018) at the Tate Modern, London.

Galerie Michael Sturm, founded in 1996 in Stuttgart, Germany, has worked with international artists such as Bridget Riley, Max Cole, Marcia Hafif, Frank Badur and Russell Maltz. **Bäckerstrasse4**, founded in Vienna in 2008, has focused from the beginning on the development of young, international artists, selected by a distinguished jury, such as Eckhard Schneider, Andrew Renton, Adam Budak and Schmidt Wulffen.

Galerie Sturm & Schober, Galerie Michael Sturm and bäckerstrasse4 have been exhibitors at the most important fairs in Austria and Germany as well as international fairs, including ArtBo (Bogotá), Zona Maco (Mexico City), Parc Lima, Untitled Miami, Solo Project Basel and Art Brussels.
